## **COVID-19** Case Update in Warren County

The Warren County Health Department is confirming the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> COVID-19 related deaths. The individuals were both males between the ages of 60-80. Our deepest sympathies go out to their families and friends. We continue to urge our community to do what you can to slow the spread of the virus.

The health department is announcing 21 additional confirmed cases of coronavirus disease (COVID-19), bringing the total cases to 921. 765 cases have had their symptoms resolve. Due to federal privacy restrictions, release of any additional information is prohibited. To date there have been 6348 negative tests.

The new cases include:

- 2 females between the ages of 20-40
- 1 female between the ages of 40-60
- 3 females between the ages of 60-80
- 2 females between the ages of 80-100
- 2 males between the ages of 0-10
- 5 males between the ages of 20-40
- 1 male between the ages of 40-60
- 5 males between the ages of 60-80

County level COVID-19 metrics for **Week 46** from **November 8–November 14, 2020** have kept **Warren County at the WARNING level.** IDPH uses numerous indicators when determining warning signs of increased risk in the county. A county is considered at a warning level when at least two of the following metrics trigger a warning.
