COVID-19 Case Update in Warren County

The Warren County Health Department is announcing 3 additional confirmed cases of coronavirus disease (COVID-19), bringing the total cases to 1515. 1413 cases have had their symptoms resolve. Due to federal privacy restrictions, release of any additional information is prohibited. To date there have been 9002 negative tests and 41 confirmed COVID-19 related deaths.
