### COVID-19 Case Update in Warren County October 31 – November 6, 2021

The Warren County Health Department is announcing 35 additional confirmed cases of coronavirus disease (COVID-19), bringing the total cases to 2484. 2385 cases have had their symptoms resolve. Due to federal privacy restrictions, release of any additional information is prohibited. To date there have been 67 confirmed COVID-19 related deaths.

New cases include:

County level COVID-19 metrics for **Week 43** from **October 24-October 30, 2021** for Warren County indicate we are in **WARNING** with **high community transmission**. IDPH uses numerous indicators when determining warning signs of increased risk in the county. A county is considered at a warning level when at least two of the following metrics trigger a warning.
